

Students are expected to be in dress code upon arrival at school and remain in dress code throughout the day. *Administrators & Teachers reserve the right to determine the appropriateness of dress in cases not covered by the dress code*. All clothing should be clean, neat and free of holes or stains with no cut or torn necklines, hemlines, sleeves, sides, etc. Students are not permitted to wear tie dye or camouflage. Students deemed out of dress code will be asked to contact a parent/guardian for appropriate attire and wait in ISS until they are dressed accordingly.

I. Tops

- Tops should be solid, stripe, plaid, floral, color blocking, or an all over pattern.
- Tops cannot have any graphics other than a **single logo smaller than 3x3**. (Size of a post-it note)
- Tops must have sleeves.
- Dresses should be solid, stripe, plaid, floral, color blocking, or an all over pattern.
 - Sleeveless dresses must have at least two inches width straps (no spaghetti straps)
- Dresses cannot have any graphics other than a **single logo smaller than 3x3**. (Size of a post-it note)
- JDS approved "spirit wear" may be worn.
 - Items that are not from school approved vendors or homemade are not considered dress code.
- Shirts do not have to be tucked in but must always cover the student's mid-section.

II. Coats/Jackets/Cardigan Sweaters

- Jackets should be solid, stripe, plaid, floral, color blocking, or an all over pattern.
- Jackets cannot have any graphics other than a **single logo smaller than 3x3**. (Size of a post-it note)
- JDS Team Jackets with school name can be worn. (Must be current year team jacket and student must be on team)

III. Bottoms

- Students may wear solid-colored shorts, dress slacks, casual slacks, or denim jeans with a button or a clasp. (Free of holes, rips, tears, embellishments, etc.)
- Pants should be always worn at waist level and should not drag on the floor.
- Shorts and skirts must be fingertip length.

Updated July 17th, 2024

- Pants, Skirts, Shorts or Dresses may not be tight, or form fitted.
- No jeggings, No leggings, No sweat or athletic pants (unless worn under a dress or skirt for modesty), No yoga pants, No gym shorts.

IV. Shoes/Socks/Tights

- No flip flop, slides, or bedroom shoes. Sandals (with heel straps) and Crocs (with heel straps) and Yeezy (with heel straps) are permitted. Note: Heal straps must be worn at all times.
- Students are permitted to wear socks, and tights of their choice, fitting the modesty standards of the school.

V. Hair

- Students' hairstyles are not to be distracting to others and must be what is considered socially responsible. (No mohawks, writing or designs in hair, unnatural brightly colored hair, this includes unnatural colored tips and highlights, etc.)
- No unnatural hair-colored accessories will be allowed.
- Hair should be out of the eyes at all times.
- Facial hair must be neatly groomed.
- Plain headbands no wider than 2 inches worn specifically for pulling back hair are the only headwear permitted.

VI. Jewelry

- Jewelry, earrings, and accessories are acceptable as long as they are conservative and in keeping with the spirit of the dress code. (No gauges, plugs, or tunnels)
- No other visible body or facial piercings or visible tattoos will be allowed with the exception of one nose piercing stud of 2mm or less in diameter.

VII. Other

- No hats, head coverings or hoods, including bandanas, will be allowed during school hours inside or outside the building. Bandana print headbands are not allowed.
- Students are to be clean and free of offensive odor.
- Air pods and wired/wireless earbuds are not permitted to be worn during school hours. Visible headphones with a band are only permitted with teacher permission for educational purposes during instructional purposes.
- No rolling bookbags or shoes with wheels.
- Animal or character accessories are not permitted.
- Undergarments should not be visible.
- Clothing will not be permitted that include images or references to violence, drugs, alcohol, profanity, weapons, sexual in nature, or anything that could be deemed offensive in nature.
